Please help our hospitalized Veterans.

The New York State Elks Association annually collects raw deer hides and the monies gathered from this great program are then distributed, on a monthly basis, to all the veterans hospitals in the State of New York. Donated hides may be dropped off at any local participating Elks Lodge where they will be salted and prepared for the tannery. Rapid deterioration is a big factor so we suggest that no plastic bags be used unless air is allowed to circulate in the bag. The tannery will not accept any hide that has deteriorated so please, let us all do our best to keep the hides in shape for the benefit of our hospitalized Vets. In return for your hide, a \$35 tax deductable certificate will be issued to the individual making the hide donation. There will be a sign-in sheet at each Lodge location which requires name, address and license type and number. Beacon Grant Helps Brighten the Night for Young Adults

Break out your sunglasses, because the world just got brighter for some.

Thanks, in part, to an Elks National Foundation Beacon Grant, the Kinderhook Elks were able to expand their charitable activities and make a difference in the community by hosting a "prom-style" dinner dance for developmentally disabled young adults on November 10th. Approximately 60-65 young adults brought their high energy, smiles and laughter to the Lodge while attending a prom held in their honor. Chairperson Linda Baker and ER Charles E. Cotsonas teamed to develop the prom concept and, with the help of a Beacon Grant from the Elks National Foundation, the concept developed into a reality. Since Beacon Grants offer Lodges a chance to expand their charitable activities, and to make a difference in the community through an ongoing project, the Elks are projecting a yearly, similar type event may also become a reality. The Lodge hopes the community will identify our Lodge with this project and know that the Elks are a force for positive change.
