
Thank you for everything you all do for the Lodge and the community we serve. It's not about us, it's about the community, Veterans and youth.

Kyle Stickles was a very active 11-year-old boy when he was diagnosed with osteosarcoma (bone cancer) in his left tibia on September 23, 2020. He loved playing football and baseball and was a 6th grade student at Ichabod Crane Middle School. Kyle needed several blood transfusions during the 8.5 months he was receiving chemo. The blood and platelets he received were critical for his treatment and recovery.


